With medals and badges, awards of all kinds A sober thought came through my mind.

For this house was different, it was dark and dreary,

I found the home of a soldier, once I could see clearly.

The soldier lay sleeping, silent, alone, Curled up on the floor in this one bedroom home.

The face was so gentle, the room in such disorder,

Not how I pictured a United States soldier.

Was this the hero of whom I'd just read? Curled up on a poncho, the floor for a bed?

I realized the families that I saw this night, Owed their lives to these soldiers who were willing to fight. Soon round the world, the children would play, And grownups would celebrate a bright Christmas day.

They all enjoyed freedom each month of the year,

Because of the soldiers, like the one lying here.

I couldn't help wonder how many lay alone, On a cold Christmas eve in a land far from home.

The very thought brought a tear to my eye, I dropped to my knees and started to cry.

The soldier awakened and I heard a rough voice,

"Santa don't cry, this life is my choice;

I fight for freedom, I don't ask for more, My life is my God, my country, my corps."

The soldier rolled over and drifted to sleep, I couldn't control it, I continued to weep.

I kept watch for hours, so silent and still And we both shivered from the cold night's chill.

I didn't want to leave on that cold, dark, night, This guardian of honor so willing to fight.

Then the soldier rolled over, with a voice soft and pure, whispered, "carry on Santa, it's Christmas day, all is secure."

One look at my watch, and I knew he was right. "Merry Christmas my friend, and to all a good night.

I was looking at Christmas songs this week and was amazed by how few of them use the word love. Now that doesn't mean that God's love isn't implied in the songs not using the word, but other themes are more often covered in Christmas songs. We sing of the actual events – the manger, the shepherds, the angels. We sing of peace and joy. We sing worship and adoration. We sing about the radiance of God's glory. We even sing about the weather; it was clear (at midnight) and all was calm and bright. Yet the song In the Bleak Midwinter speaks of a frosty wind. Maybe weathermen 2000 years ago were no better than they are today!

We do find mention of love in the fourth verse of *Silent Night*.

Silent night, holy night, Son of God, love's pure light, radiant beams from Thy holy face, with the dawn of redeeming grace, Jesus, Lord at Thy birth, Jesus, Lord at Thy birth.

Love is also declared in the fourth verse of *Joy to the World*.

He rules the world with truth and grace, And makes the nations prove, The glories of His righteousness, And wonders of His love, And wonders of His love, And wonders, wonders of His love.

That's about it. All the other Christmas songs are great. I love singing them (yes, even the ones that are not quite biblically accurate). I was just surprised more of them didn't express God's love in coming down to earth. Isn't that the reason Jesus came in the first place? For God so <u>loved</u> the world that he gave His one and only Son...Why did Jesus come to earth? To save us. Why save us? Because He loves us!

The account of the birth of Jesus is just bursting with love. A young virgin named Mary is visited by an angel. The angel tells her she is going to bear the Son of God, conceived by the Holy Spirit. What is her response? May it be to me as you have said. With all the negative ramifications of being found with child before consummating the marriage, she says, 'OK God, whatever you want.' That is a response born out of a love for God. *This is love for God: to obey his commands.* **1** *John 5:3*

Joseph finds out that Mary is with child. He has three options. The law said he could have her stoned to death. He could make a huge spectacle of it and divorce her with much fanfare, bringing shame and disgrace to her. His third option was the only loving option he could think of. Divorce her quietly so she would not have to bear the shame. Because he loved Mary so much, he chose to put her well being over any possible thoughts of revenge or retaliation. By the way, marrying her really wasn't an option for any good Hebrew man.

Joseph is visited by an angel in a dream. The angel tells Joseph what was going on and that he should not be afraid to take Mary as his wife. Joseph shows his love for God by obeying Him and resolving to stay with Mary.

Elizabeth and Zachariah show Mary love by taking her into their home. Joseph lovingly cares for Mary as they travel to Bethlehem and I am sure his heart was broken as they spent the night where animals bed down.

Then Jesus was born and God's love that had been trickling out into this obscure Hebrew family exploded into the world. Angels filled the skies over shepherds' fields. Shepherds rushed to the place where Jesus was to witness the wonder, bringing encouragement to Mary. They told everyone and went back praising God.

Recipe Swap

BUTTERSCOTCH BUBBLE BREAD

1 pkg. frozen bread dough rolls
1 tsp. cinnamon
½ c. chopped nuts
½ c. melted butter
1 c. brown sugar
½ pkg. dry butterscotch pudding, cooked kind- do not cook
2 T. milk

Place frozen rolls in a well greased bundt or tube pan. Sprinkle brown sugar, cinnamon, nuts and dry pudding on top. Pour on melted butter and milk. Cover with foil and a towel. Let stand on counter overnight. Bake at 350* for 30 to 40 minutes. Invert on a platter. This sometimes overflows the pan overnight so I put it on a cookie sheet. This is our favorite Christmas morning breakfast.
