Introducing the Todd Becker Foundation

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." **Matthew 9:37-38**

Todd Becker was an all-American kid who had it all. Todd Becker's story is the story of almost every young person today – **a story of choices**. With potential overflowing and a promising future ahead, Todd's potential and future were cut short when he was killed in an alcohol-related car accident as just a senior in high school.

A starter on the football team, a state finalist in the pole vault competition and dreams of playing baseball in college, Todd had everything to live for and everything to look forward to. But unfortunately, choice by choice and step by step, Todd's potential came to an end when his final choice cost him his life.

Still today, Todd's story is one that virtually every high school student can indentify with – a story of choices. It's a sad story – but a it's a moving story. And it's a story that has moved nearly 50,000 high school students across the Midwest to consider "where their life is headed."

In February, VFCC will be partnering with the Todd Becker Foundation, along with some other area churches, to bring the life changing message of Jesus Christ to Jefferson County. We will need some people from our church willing to counsel teens, so here is some information about the Todd Becker Foundation.

The Todd Becker Foundation was created following the death of 18-year old Todd Becker who was killed in an alcohol related car crash as a senior in high school. Todd's brother, Keith, founded the ministry in 2005. Since then, the foundation has shared Todd's story with thousands of students across the Midwest.

The Foundation travels throughout the Midwest and puts on assembly presentations and evening outreaches to public high schools, grades 9-12. The assembly unfolds the tragic and life-changing choices that ultimately led to the death of Todd Becker, and includes live music, videos and many other media elements.

Their desire is to impact students for eternity, not just a few Friday nights. Thus, their primary purpose is to draw young people into a life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ. Their mission statement: *The Foundation's purpose is to motivate high school students to discover their potentials and ultimately discover themselves by placing faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.*

The Foundation is a Christian organization, but they fully understand that they are presenting in a public school setting and are very mindful of the boundaries that must be kept. Here's how it works:

When the Todd Becker Foundation visits a high school, they typically put on two separate events/assemblies. The first is an afternoon assembly for grades 9-12, which is held during the school hours. This assembly tells the tragic Todd Becker story and challenges the students to take the narrow road, according to the scripture Matthew 7:13. The major focus of this message is choices and their consequences.

That same evening, students, parents and the community are invited back to a second event where the band puts on a concert and an entirely different story and message is presented. This evening event focuses primarily on the story of how Todd's brother, Keith, came to faith in Christ following his brother's death. Having said that, the evening event is where the Gospel of Jesus Christ is presented and the major focus is the salvation message.

How are we involved? The assembly will be held at the Oskaloosa High School on February 6. Buses will take the high school students from Valley Falls, McLouth and JCN to join Oskaloosa at the afternoon event. Those students are invited back for the evening event along with anyone else (parents, friends, younger/older siblings, etc.) from the area. At the evening event, they will need solid Christians to counsel anyone who makes a decision for Christ and also will need churches to follow up on those decisions.

Recipe Swap CHEESY SPINACH & BACON DIP

1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen, chopped spinach, thawed, drained 1 lb. (16 oz.) velveeta, cut into ½ in. cubes 4 oz. cream cheese, cubed

10 oz. rotel, undrained 8 slices cooked bacon, crumbled

Microwave ingredients in microwaveable bowl on High 5 min. or until velveeta is completely melted and mixture is well blended, stirring after 3 minutes.

BACON CHEESEBURGER ROLL-UP

1 lb. ground beef
4 slices bacon, chopped
1 small onion, chopped
½ lb. velveeta, cut into ½ inch cubes
1 pkg. (13.8 oz.) refrigerated pizza crust

Heat oven to 400*. Brown ground beef, bacon and onions in large skillet on medium high heat; drain. Return meat to skillet. Add velveeta; cook 5 minutes or until melted, stirring frequently. Cool 10 minutes. Unroll dough onto baking sheet sprayed with cooking spray. Press into 15x8 inch rectangle; top with meat mixture. Roll up starting at one long side. Rearrange if necessary so roll is seam side down. Bake 20-25 minutes or until golden brown.
