Musings from the Mail Route

My part-time, temporary position as the Valley Falls mail carrier ended uneventfully after nine months on the job. It was a blessing to have the job, but I was ready for it to be over. Here are some observations I have made over the last nine months on the route (and four years carrying mail in Lawrence before I went into the ministry).

Kids are always happy to see the mailman. When you walk up to a house and the kids are outside or at the door, they always want to get the mail. They might even fight over who gets it. They don't care what is in it. They don't care if it is for them or not. They don't have any anticipation that it might be unwelcome news.

Adults, on the other hand, are usually not as excited to get mail. Except for those times when someone expects a check or they have ordered something and are awaiting a package, they usually grumble. "If it's bills, you can keep them" (like I never heard that one before!). "It's just a bunch of junk mail." "Somebody wants money." Adults often see mail as a nuisance at best and a necessary evil other times. This is especially true when they get mail from bill collectors, lawyers or utility companies.

We should be more like the kids when we receive the message of the gospel. Just be happy to see the one delivering it, accept it with grace and don't think about any negatives (hardships) that may come from living the Christian life. In other words, have the faith of a child.

There are a lot of houses that look junky when you drive by. Junk, trash, old beer cans are strewn all through the yard. The house is in obvious disrepair. There are a lot of people who are like that as well. You can glance and think that they are in spiritual disrepair. You see worldly 'junk' in the way they live their lives that gives them away. Maybe it is the profane language they use. Maybe it is the alcohol you always smell on their breath. Maybe it is

the clothes they wear, i.e. profane messages on t-shirts or very revealing clothes.

Then there are a lot of houses that look OK when you drive by, but...When you get up close to the houses, you notice things you may not notice when you drive by. Maybe the house looks good at a glance, but when you walk by to deliver the mail, you notice the foundation is cracked, the paint is peeling or the eaves are rotting. The siding that was put on 20 years ago doesn't look so good anymore. What looks like a nice green lawn you notice is actually chickweed or crabgrass.

I want to make two analogies here. Some people look good when you give them a quick once over. They seem to have it together. But upon closer inspection, you find out there are serious flaws they are hiding. Not the daily sin that we all struggle with, but habitual sin that rots one from the inside out spiritually. Sin they would rather ignore and aren't willing to deal with. Hidden things you might find out if you really got to know them. The problem may be pride, gossip, lying or greed. When you get close to a house (for instance when you inspect it before buying it) you find out the real character of the house. When you get close to a person, you may get to find the real character of that person even though they have been trying to hide their flaws. They need a friend who will share the gospel with them.

The second point is the flip side of the first. Sometimes what is being covered up isn't sin, it is pain. When you 'drive by' people, it is kind of like the conversation that goes, "How are you? I'm fine. OK, see you later." Upon closer inspection, if you walk with this person instead of driving by, you find out they are hurting and are trying to deal with it by themselves. They need a friend they can confide in and trust and who will give them biblical wisdom and encouragement.

Recipe Swap

PUNCH BOWL DESSERT

1 angel food cake

2 6oz. pkgs. Instant vanilla pudding 1 or 2 cans cherry or strawberry pie filling

1 12oz. can of crushed pineapple, drained

1 large container cool whip

1 pkg. chopped pecans

Tear up angel food cake and place half into bottom of the punch bowl. Mix pudding and pour half of it on top of the angel food cake. Let set for 5-10 minutes, or until firm. Layer ½ of your pie filling on top of the pudding, followed by a layer of ½ of your pineapple and finally a layer of ½ of your cool whip. Repeat layers and top with chopped pecans. Refrigerate overnight.

This is a wonderful dessert to take to any kind of family gathering or any time you want something for a crowd.
