LIGHT UP THE CHURCH BUILDING

A little story that illustrates the problem of attendance goes like this:

In a certain mountain village in Europe several centuries ago, a nobleman wondered what legacy he should leave to people in his town. At last he decided to build them a church building.

No one saw the complete plans for the building until it was finished. When the people gathered, they marveled at its beauty and completeness. Then someone asked, "But where are the lamps? How will it be lighted?"

The nobleman pointed to some brackets in the walls. Then he gave to each family a candle which they were to bring with them each time they came to worship.

"Each time you are here the area where you are seated will be lighted," the nobleman said. "Each time you are not here, that area will be dark. This is to remind you that whenever you fail to come to church, some part of God's house will be dark." Does anyone at our church want to try to save the electricity we normally use on Sundays or Wednesdays? Should we start giving out candles next Sunday? This is just a story but it has a stinging point. Those who seldom, if ever, attend worship or Bible Study in the evening may be like those of whom it was said: "The people which sat in darkness saw great light; and to them which sat in the region and shadow of death light is sprung up" (Matthew 4:16). That is, if they happened to see the church building in the evening from a distance.

Jesus also said, "Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hid. Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house" (Matthew 5:14-15). Attending all services of the church is letting your light shine – after all you come to worship God and study His word – then leave to serve.

Maybe it would be good to pray, "For thou wilt light my candle: the LORD my God will enlighten my darkness" (Psalm 18:28). There was the guy who still had his 1973 calendar on the wall. When asked why, he replied, "I don't like change."

We are getting ready to celebrate another new year. For some it means, "Ugh, another year older!" Others see it as a new opportunity. That is why so many people make New Year's resolutions. They want to do something different. They want a change. Lose weight. Exercise more. Read the Bible through in a year. Be a better mom, dad, son or daughter.

For people who don't like change, I can see where a new year might cause some consternation. I can also see where the Bible might cause these folks some stress as well. The Bible talks a lot about 'new.' If you don't like 'new', there are several topics in the Bible that will cause you problems.

See, God likes doing new stuff. *Isaiah 43:19 (ESV) Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.*

The problem people have with new things is they like the way things are. They like the status quo. They don't want to see change. Jesus understood this about people. **Luke 5:37 (ESV)** And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the new wine will burst the skins and it will be spilled, and the skins will be destroyed.

Wineskins were made from the fresh skins of animals. As the grape juice fermented, it would expand and the new skins would stretch to accommodate that without bursting. After the juice is wine and stops fermenting, the skins dry out and become more brittle.

After the wine is consumed, if you tried to put the grape juice into the old, dried out skin, when it expanded, the skin would burst, wasting all the juice.

Jesus continued, "*Luke 5:38-39 (ESV)* But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. And no one after drinking old wine desires new, for he says, '*The old is good*.'" That is the people who say, "Oh, I like the old way! It is better! You keep your new stuff." The old and the new don't mix well.

The problem with that attitude is Jesus was bringing new stuff. God is in the business of new. **New covenant:** Jeremiah 31:31 "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah,

The old covenant was written on stone. The new covenant is written on our hearts and minds. Sins under the old covenant were paid for by the blood of bulls and goats and other sacrifices. The sin wasn't really erased, just pushed forward into

another year. Sin under the new covenant is paid for once and for all by the blood of Jesus. His sacrifice takes our sin away. New is better. **New mercy:** *Lamentations 3:22-23 The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.* After we become Christians, since we are no longer under the old sacrificial system, we merely need to confess our sins to God and he will forgive them. Every day we get to experience his mercy

afresh. **New song:** *Psalm 96:1* Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! God's daily mercy should cause us to break out in joyful song. A clean slate every day; a new song to go with it.

New creation: 2 *Corinthians* **5:17** *Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.* When we submit to the new covenant through faith in Christ, there is a change. The old self dies and we are born again.

Part of being a new creation is...

New heart: Ezekiel 36:26 And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

New commandment: John 13:34 A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. Since we are new creations with a new heart, we are called to love in a new way. We love others in the sacrificial way that Christ loves us.

Guess what? All this new stuff means we will have a new destination.

New heaven and a new earth. Isaiah 65:17 "For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. Revelation 21:1 Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more.

As we turn the page from December 2014 to January 2015, let's remember that new is good. We have been blessed by many new people who weren't here two years ago. New folks always change the dynamic of a church.This is awesome! Let's keep growing!

Dedicate 2015 to the Lord. Let us as a church strive to reach new people and look for new ways to share God's unchanging truth. God is doing a new thing in Valley Falls. Let's be a part of it!

Recipe Swap

SLOW COOKED CORN CHOWDER

2-1/2 cups milk
1 can (14-3/4 ounces) creamed corn
1 can cream of mushroom soup,
undiluted
1-3/4 cups frozen corn
1 cup frozen shredded hash browns
1 cup cooked ham, cubed
1 large onion, chopped
2 T. butter
2 tsp. dried parsley
Salt and pepper to taste

In a slow cooker, combine all ingredients. Cover and cook on low for 6 hours.
