The Word of the Month: Thanks

1 Thessalonians 5:18 Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

I recently read about the story of a husband and wife who were unable to conceive any children. This was frustrating and heart breaking as they questioned why God would allow this void in a believing couple who so desired children.

On some days of dreaming, they'd deliberate over what they might name a child if they were ever to have one. They had always been able to settle on a boy's name, but they both had a different favorite for a girl. The wife liked the name Autumn; the husband preferred Amanda.

But still, no child came. Boy or girl. So, after ten years of trying, they went to Plan B and decided to adopt siblings.

So they prayed. They asked God to work His perfect will, to match them with just the right children from just the right situation. One day the adoption agency called with the news that two sisters--ages three and five--had been relinquished by their mother. Though she wasn't a believer herself, the woman had requested that her daughters be placed with a Christian family. That had moved this couple's name to the top of the list.

When they asked the social worker to tell them more about the girls, here's what she said: "They're both green-eyed blondes. The five-year-old is named Autumn. The three-year-old is named Amanda."

Wow! These kinds of situations make it very easy to see that God is involved – which make it easy to give thanks to God for the blessing.

Are there times when something amazing happens in your life and you are sure it is from God? Do you remember to tell God thank you when He is so obviously involved?

I hope all of us have made a habit out of thanking God in those situations. But if we forget to thank God when He is clearly blessing us, how will we ever remember to thank him in ALL circumstances, as 1 Thessalonians 5:18 commands?

We should all work at developing an attitude of gratitude. It is never too late!

I think of training our children. They never have a problem saying, "I want," but we always have to teach them please and thank you. Hopefully, as our children grow, saying thank you becomes a habit.

As children of God, we need to develop that same habit – not just when the big things happen, or the great things happen, but all the time. That means when we don't see anything particularly wonderful to thank God for, we need to open our eyes to the everyday blessings that come from God. It also means we need to give thanks when there seems to be nothing to be thankful for in our current situation.

Though it sometimes seems cliché or trite – especially coming from someone who doesn't seem to have any problems at the moment – there is always something to give thanks for.

I've seen many memes on the internet about thankfulness. They go something like: If there is a sink full of dirty dishes, be thankful you had food to eat. If there are piles of dirty laundry, be thankful you have clothes to wear. And so on, and so on...

But what about cancer? What about death? How can we be thankful in those situations? We can. We can be thankful for the years we had with the loved one we lost. We can be thankful for our memories. We can be thankful for doctors and researchers that bring us medicine and treatments. The verse doesn't say we have to be thankful FOR the situation, but when we are in the situation, find things about which you can thank God.

Remember, the bread and wine Jesus ate at the Last Supper were symbols of his death, yet he gave thanks for them.

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Recipe Swap

PUMPKIN BARS

Preheat oven to 350*. Grease a 9x13 pan.

1 cup flour

1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

½ tsp. baking powder

½ tsp. baking soda

½ cup vegetable oil

1 cup sugar

2 eggs

1 cup pumpkin

3/4 cup raisins

Mix dry ingredients in a bowl. In a mixer bowl beat oil, sugar, eggs and pumpkin. Add dry ingredients and beat until well mixed. Stir in raisins by hand. Pour into greased pan and bake for 30-40 minutes or until done. Cool. Make a glaze of ½ cup powdered sugar and 1 T. real maple syrup. You can add a little water to the glaze if needed. Drizzle it over the top of the bars.
