OUTREACH 13TH ANNUAL FREE SCHOOL SUPPLY WRAP-UP

Saturday, July 25th, God blessed the free school supply project with over 40 volunteers from different churches, organizations and businesses to reflect His love to meet the needs of others. The fruit of the spirit was present in everyone as they worked side by side to meet the needs of many thankful families.

Thanks to all of you who helped in any way through prayer, giving of your time, monetary gifts, donating supplies and clothing, hauling supplies and for the food and anything we forgot to mention!!!!

Over 285 students came to pick up supplies. Families are still making request for supplies, making our total over 320 students.

Almost Finished!

After church on August 23rd, Stan Farr gave us an update on the building project. Simply put, the funds for the building project had been either used or earmarked and we needed to ask the congregation for more money.

So there is no confusion, we should be clear that when the building was proposed, it was a two phase project. Phase one was the foundation and building exterior, while phase two was finishing it up. We have gotten a lot more done in phase one than expected. Stan went over some of the projects that still must be done before we finish, with the cost of those projects estimated at around \$30,000. That number is quite a bit less than phase two was thought to be. I feel we are blessed to be where we are in this project.

During the meeting after church, it was suggested that we have another special offering on Sunday, August 30 to see how close we could come to make up the difference. If we do not raise adequate funds from the church family we will have to pursue other avenues to finish the building. The congregation consented, so after church on August 30, we will have a special offering. Stan asked everyone to pray for this project and how they would be able to help during the week leading up to the offering.

Along with the offering, we will also accept pledges for future offerings. We know many people pledged a certain amount a month for a year as we began the project last year. The people who pledged have been very faithful about keeping their pledge. We thank them and thank the Lord for that. As a part of the offering, anyone may extend their pledge for another year, or they may increase the amount of their pledge. Those who perhaps gave a one time offering, but no monthly pledge could begin a monthly pledge.

Anyone who is absent on the 30th or is unable to give on that day, but can give in the future can use the building offering envelopes provided in the pews anytime. Holiness in the Bible has the meaning of separation or setting apart. It indicates sanctity or separation from all that is sinful or impure (New Unger's Bible Dictionary).

Leviticus 20:7 (ESV) Consecrate yourselves, therefore, and be holy, for I am the LORD your God.

We see in this verse the idea of setting apart (consecration). We also see two aspects of holiness. God is holy because that is His nature. It is who He is. He can be no other. It is impossible for God to be unholy in any way, shape or form.

Because of His holiness, we can be made holy when He sets us apart. The holiness of people, places or things is only by the association with or proclamation by the one who is intrinsically holy – God.

This awareness of holiness should cause us to reconsider how we see God – how we react to Him and interact with Him. I say awareness, because I don't really feel we can fully understand what the holiness of God is all about. We can be made aware that He is holy and can obtain a general idea of it, but full knowledge is impossible as long as we are on this side of glory.

The New Testament word for holy is hagios. It comes from the Greek root hagos, which means an awful thing. Our God is described as an awful thing. So is God horrible? Terrible? It would surely be a horrible thing for something impure to stand before a holy God. Let's think about awful as full of awe. God is fully awesome. He should elicit awe in all who come into contact with Him.

Awe is a combination of wonder and fear. We should be full of wonder and joy and fear and respect in the presence of God.

Isaiah has a vision of God: In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" [Isaiah 6:1-5 (ESV)]

Isaiah is confronted with the holiness of God. He doesn't get a warm fuzzy feeling. He isn't posting on Facebook about how cool it was to be surrounded by light and have the angels usher him into complete bliss in the presence of God. No! He thinks he is going to die!

In Revelation, John has a vision of the Lord. *Revelation 1:17a (ESV)* When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead...

I think the church has lost the concept of the holiness of God. We have forgotten how awful God is. Because He chose to dwell with man through His Son, we ignore that he is still set apart, other than and higher than we could ever be. Because God wants to be our savior, our friend and our Father we forget that there will still be justice and judgment because His holiness cannot be violated.

Our response to God's holiness requires action. It requires a decision. He tells us (yes, us! Humans! His people – the church.) to be holy because He is holy.

How can that be? How can people be holy like God is holy? In the sense that we would become awful - we don't. We will never have the glory and majesty of God. God's command is for us to be set apart. We are set apart as His people. We are set apart for His service. We are set apart to point others to the holiness of God. This happens because God does the work.

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." [Isaiah 6:6-7 (ESV)]

God took Isaiah's guilt away. The barrier between Isaiah's filthiness and God's holiness was gone.

Revelation 1:17b-18 (ESV) But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, ¹⁸ and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades.

In the New Covenant, Jesus Christ takes away the barrier between God and man. He died as a sacrifice to pay our sin debt.
