A Tale of Two Pastors

Pastor Jordan Brown is the pastor of the LGBTQ affirming Church of the Open Doors in Austin, Texas. He ordered a cake from Austin based Whole Foods Market with the message "Love Wins" in order to convey that love wins no matter what your sexual orientation is.

Pastor Brown claimed that a Whole Foods employee added a gay slur to the end of the message and is now suing the grocery chain.

But wait! It appears that Whole Foods is fighting back. Whole Foods claim that their employees did NOT alter the cake. In fact, the bakery employee is part of the LGBTQ community. They claim that Pastor Brown is perpetrating a hoax and changed the message on the cake himself and are countersuing.

Why would Brown make up this story? Perhaps since the media in today's culture is so eager to bend over backwards for anything that affirms the gay lifestyle, he thought this would be an easy case to win in the court of public opinion and Whole Foods would be willing to pay a lot of money just to make it go away. Perhaps he was looking for celebrity status for himself or his church.

Meanwhile, a Georgia bi-vocational pastor, Dr. Eric Walsh, has been fired from his secular job because of his sermons. Dr. Walsh worked for the Georgia Department of Public Health and is a Seventh Day Adventist lay minister. Dr. Walsh is represented by First Liberty in his lawsuit against the state of Georgia. They contend that the Georgia Department of Public Health assigned workers to investigate sermons Dr. Walsh delivered on health, marriage, sexuality, world religions, science and creationism.

I share this because this is a microcosm of what is going on in our culture today. This is the world we send our graduates into. A world in which people allegedly create a fake discrimination in order to gain...sympathy? Followers? To promote an agenda? 15 minutes of fame?

A world in which our government can take something said from a church pulpit and use it against a public sector employee. A world in which college students are apparently so distraught over another's free speech that they need a safe space where the only things that can be said are things they agree with. A world in which a 4 year old child is asked to choose their gender and pre-teen children are given hormone treatments to correspond to the gender they want to be. A world in which bakers, florists,

resort owners, etc. are not allowed to do business in keeping with their deeply held religious beliefs if it offends a small minority of the population. A world in which...need I go on?

The pressure upon the 18 and 19 year old young men and women to throw away their faith based values is tremendous. Parents, the pressure begins in elementary school. It is in the media your children consume. It comes from their friends. It is buried in the curriculum in most schools.

By the time our students enter college, many will be forced to receive training classes in diversity, tolerance and acceptance. Many other universities are considering such classes. They will teach incoming students about acceptance of everything except a worldview based on the God's word.

I am not confident that this trend will reverse itself. In fact, there are some scriptures that speak directly to the direction our culture is heading.

1 Timothy 4:1-2 (ESV) ...in later times some will depart from the faith by devoting themselves to deceitful spirits and teachings of demons, through the insincerity of liars whose consciences are seared...

2 Timothy 3:1-7 (ESV) ...in the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions, always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth.

What can we do? It goes without saying that we must watch and pray. Pray for revival in this land. Pray for a return to biblical values. Watch what your children are consuming on TV, the internet, in school and from friends.

But also remember, God did not promise Christians a friendly, easy culture in which to live. In fact, history tells us that it is usually the opposite. The first 200 years of faith friendly life in America are not the norm throughout time. It has been a blessing that God could easily remove as the nation gets farther and farther from Him.

Bubble Ring

1 pkg. Rhodes frozen dough rolls

1 lg pkg. butterscotch pudding, the cooked kind

½ c. brown sugar

½ c. butter

Place roll dough in a well greased bundt pan. Spoon pudding mix over rolls. Melt butter and brown sugar and drizzle over rolls. Let rise overnight or for 8 hours. Bake at 350* for 30 minutes.

So in this culture, we must prepare our children to stay strong and swim against the cultural tide of sin so they don't waver and doubt and end up just going with the flow.

- 1. Begin now. Even if your child is a senior in high school and you think they already have their mind made up to accept everything the culture throws at them, you have to talk to them from the truth of the Bible.
- 2. Begin early. If you think it is too early to begin talking about these things, it probably isn't. They are already getting anti-biblical information that shapes their thinking. When anything comes up (from school, a TV show they are watching, something a friend said, etc.) that goes against God's word, use that as a teaching time to talk about what God's word savs.
- 3. Truth cannot be divorced from love. We must love the people we disagree with, even if they consider us their enemies for not following the culture.

We have to be ready to do what Paul told Timothy – with our children and grandchildren as the audience. 2 Timothy 4:2-5 (ESV) Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. For the time is coming when people will not endure sound teaching, but having itching ears they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own passions, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander off into myths. As for you, always be sober-minded, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

One pastor is riding the cultural wave perhaps even trying to cash in on it. He's just going with whatever makes him feel affirmed. The other pastor has looked at what God's word says about our worldview and is willing to stand upon that truth, even if it ultimately costs him his job. Which pastor will you be to your family?
