#### **Proverbs for Politicians**

I recently read an article by Dr. Michael Brown in which he encouraged Donald Trump to read one chapter from the book of Proverbs every day. He suggested to Mr. Trump that it would "almost certainly guarantee your victory in the November elections." He continued, "In fact, if you put into practice what I'm about to share with you, you could become a fine president as well."

I'd like to take that one step further. How about all of the candidates read a chapter of Proverbs every day? —And actually start doing it!

Day one: **Proverbs 1:7 (ESV)** The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.

What if our politicians feared God instead of polls, the media, focus groups or special interests? Wouldn't it be great to see elected officials tell us they aren't going to let the results of a survey dictate to them a policy that clearly violates the Bible? I know people would scream separation of church and state. So what? You aren't forcing anyone else to read the Bible or believe it. You are exercising your right apply the wisdom you have learned from the Bible in the decisions you make as you govern.

Day four: **Proverbs 4:24 (ESV)** Put away from you crooked speech, and put devious talk far from you.

"I didn't send any emails. O.K., I didn't delete any emails. Well, I deleted emails, but they didn't have classified information in them. Colin Powell told me to do it!" The lies just keep coming. Mrs. Clinton is viewed as quite untruthful by a majority of Americans.

Mr. Trump just can't stop insulting people who disagree with him. Instead of debating finer points of an issue, his default setting is to begin name calling. Maybe by the middle of the month (day 15) he could figure out that is not a good campaign strategy when he reads **Proverbs 15:1 (ESV)** A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

Day 6: **Proverbs 6:16-17 (ESV)** ...the LORD hates...hands that shed innocent blood. I find it baffling that any politician can claim to be a Christian and still think abortion

is OK. In fact, it is a good thing that the Lord knows the heart and is the final judge, because it is hard for me to believe anyone can be saved and still believe that abortion should be legal.

Day 22 would merely serve to confirm sanctity of life policies based on the fact that we are all created in God's image. **Proverbs** 22:2 (ESV) The rich and the poor meet together; the LORD is the maker of them all.

Day 10: **Proverbs 10:9 (ESV)** <sup>9</sup> Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but he who makes his ways crooked will be found out. Can't we just do the right thing and stop the cover-ups? Hilary, get a physical by a neutral group of doctors. Donald, release your tax returns. If you make a promise, keep it. If you later find that one of your key policy points is just impossible, admit it. Get rid of any shady dealings or back door deals.

The word fool or a variation thereof appears in Proverbs over 70 times. After reading through this book of wisdom, it would seem that just about every politician is a fool – and WE elect them! Here's more.

Day 12: **Proverbs 12:15 (ESV)** <sup>15</sup> The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, but a wise man listens to advice. For this proverb to actually be helpful to an elected official, they can't surround themselves with 'yes men.' If all of your advisors already agree with you all the time, you will never be challenged to consider a different perspective. A little humility goes a long way and when a politician actually listens to the people he represents he might actually learn he doesn't know it all.

Day 14: **Proverbs 14:31 (ESV)** Whoever oppresses a poor man insults his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him. The Bible teaches that we should help the poor. It also teaches that we should value hard work (consider the ant...). I believe that adhering to proverbs could lead to policies that would get most people off of welfare and get them into a job while still making sure the 'least of these' don't fall through the cracks. A hand up is always better than a hand out.

# **Recipe Swap**

#### **CHICKEN & DUMPLING CASSEROLE**

½ c. chopped onion

½ c. chopped celery

2 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 c. butter or margarine

½ c. flour

2 tsp. sugar

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. dried basil

½ tsp. pepper

4 c. chicken broth

10 oz. frozen peas

4 c. cubed cooked chicken

DUMPLINGS:

2 c. buttermilk baking mix

2 tsp. dried basil

2/3 c. milk

In a large saucepan, sauté onion, celery and garlic in butter until tender. Add flour, sugar, salt, basil, pepper and broth; bring to a boil. Cook and stir for 1 minute; reduce heat. Add peas and cook for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Stir in chicken. Pour into greased 13x9 baking dish. For dumplings, combine biscuit mix and basil in a bowl. Stir in milk with a fork until moistened. Drop by Tablespoons onto casserole -12 dumplings Bake, uncovered at 350\* for 30 minutes. Cover and bake 10 minutes more until dumplings are done.

Current policies seem to ensure that people who are in poverty and rely on the government will stay there. Maybe there even would be a policy that would encourage and empower churches to get back into helping the widows and orphans.

Day 31: **Proverbs 31:28 (ESV)** Her (the wife) children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her:

All through the proverbs, the traditional family unit is championed. How refreshing! A husband (a man), a wife (a woman) and children all living in one home as a family. A family where discipline is given in love. A family where wives and husbands abide in love and respect each other. A family where the children are taught the fear and admonition of the Lord.

The proverbs were mostly written by Solomon, the wisest man who ever lived. He wrote them to his son. They are not 'written in stone' promises, but they are principles to live by.
