Where Do We Get Our Theology?

Over 20 years ago, the first Left Behind novel by Tim LaHaye and Jerry Jenkins came out. They were fast moving and exciting to read which made them extremely popular, especially for Christian fiction. There were 16 books in the series, plus CDs, graphic novels, a series for kids, movies and video games.

The series was a fictional account of how the return of Christ would be like from a pre-millennial rapture point of view. Though it was fiction, it was based on Tim LaHaye's interpretation of biblical end times. Since this series sold over 65 million copies, a lot of people were exposed to his theological beliefs.

While it may have been an exciting read, the problem came when people began to believe what he wrote about the end times just because they read his books, as opposed to The Book! Tim LaHaye's interpretation of end times is fairly mainstream among evangelicals, so it is not bad that people were exposed to his view, but it is not the only one. Good people, good Bible believing scholars disagree on end times, so it is best for us to go to the Bible itself.

When we need to understand doctrine, theology, and God, we need to go to God's word. Without putting IN our preconceived notions, we should take OUT what God has put there for us. Now we will often use pastors, Bible scholars, commentaries, study notes and many other resources to help us understand what the Bible says, but we must always check their words with the Bible itself. The Bible is the final authority.

Ten years ago, The Shack was published and quickly became a best seller. It, too, is a work of fiction. It, too, gives the author's theological perspective. Thousands of Christians raved about the book, but should they have?

Full disclosure - I have not read the book, but I have read reviews by Christian scholars I trust. I feel a need to comment on this for two reasons. One, the immense popularity it has among Christians, and

two, next month, the movie The Shack based on the book will be released in theaters in the United States.

I want to point out just a few of the troubling aspects of The Shack to support my recommendation to avoid the movie. I also simply want to give this warning: If you go see it, please, please, please don't get your theology about God the Father, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, salvation or any other doctrine from this movie (or the book)!!!

From a review by Albert Mohler: "Papa" [represents God the Father-portrayed as an African-American woman] tells Mack of the time when the three persons of the Trinity "spoke ourself into human existence as the Son of God." Nowhere in the Bible is the Father or the Spirit described as taking on human existence. The Christology of the book is likewise confused. "Papa" tells Mack that, though Jesus is fully God, "he has never drawn upon his nature as God to do anything... Jesus, as a human being, had no power within himself to heal anyone."

Jesus specifically felt power leave himself when a woman touched his garment and was healed (Mark 5:30).

Jesus tells Mack that he is "the best way any human can relate to Papa or Sarayu [represents the Holy Spirit-depicted as Asian woman]." Not the only way, but merely the best way.

John 14:6 clearly states, "Jesus said, 'I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

The shack gives a feeling of universalism [everyone is saved] and karma which are not biblical.

Tim Challies has a very in depth (and long) review as well. He concluded this: Focusing on just three of the subjects William Young discusses in The Shack, we've seen that errors abound. He presents a false view of God and one that may well be described as heretical. He downplays the importance and uniqueness of the Bible, subjugating it (continued on back page)

RECIPE SWAP

HOT PIZZA DIP

1-1/2 tsp. Italian seasoning 8 oz. cream cheese, softened

1 c. mozzarella cheese, divided

 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. fresh parmesan cheese, grated and divided

½ bell pepper, diced

½ onion, diced

1-2 cloves garlic, minced

1 T. coconut oil

Pizza sauce

4 oz. pepperoni, diced

Combine Italian seasoning and cream cheese and spread in the bottom of a microwave safe serving dish. Top with ½ c. mozzarella cheese and ¼ c. parmesan cheese.

In sauce pan, cook bell pepper and onion in coconut oil until tender. Spread this mixture over the cheese.

Top with pizza sauce, then remaining mozzarella. Add diced pepperoni and finish with remaining parmesan cheese. Microwave at 70% power for 5-7 minutes or until bubbly.

(Doctrine - continued from page 2) or making it equal to other forms of subjective revelation. He misrepresents redemption and salvation, opening the door to the possibility of salvation outside of the completed work of Jesus Christ on the cross. We are left with an unbiblical understanding of the persons and nature of God and of His work in this world. But this is not all. The discerning reader will note as well that the author muddies the concepts of forgiveness and free will. He introduces teaching that is entirely foreign to the Bible, often stating with certainty what is merely speculative. He oversteps the bounds of Scripture while downplaying the Bible's importance. He relies too little on Scripture and too much on his own theological imaginings.

People get their theology from a lot of different places. Google, friends, TBN, music, culture - and works of fiction. Christians are called to be discerning and wise.

RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED

God has given us tremendous imaginations, and story telling is an amazing gift from God. We must be able to sift the fiction from the truth, and hold up all sources to the one source that is truth, God's holy word. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (ESV) All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
