

Many of you have undoubtedly seen the acronym K.I.S.S. It means Keep It Simple, Stupid.

By my understanding, the stupid one is not the person you are trying to explain something to. The stupid one is the person doing the explaining in a way that the recipient couldn't understand, thus wasting his or her time. The key to not being 'stupid' is understanding your audience and therefore teaching them at an appropriate level.

The Bible tells us that there is a time to keep it simple, but there is also a time to move on to more difficult topics.

The writer of Hebrews chastised his audience for their spiritual immaturity. *Hebrews 5:12-6:1 (ESV)* For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic principles of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food, for everyone who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, since he is a child. But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil. Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God.

To be sure, the gospel message and teaching about the kingdom of God is both so simple a child can understand it and so deep that the most intelligent PhD will never find the end of it.

Which brings me to our MLCC theme for the summer: Deny Your Selfie. Most of us are familiar with the trend that has been going on for years since smart phones have become so prevalent. A lot of people like to take pictures of themselves.

Sometimes it is because they are with other people, and they want to take pictures of them together. Often, though, people will post pictures of only themselves, hoping to get positive feedback through social media. They want others to affirm them. "Hey, look at me!"

Nothing could be farther from the heart of Jesus than worrying about 'self.'

The theme verse is Luke 9:23. "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

As dean of the Jr. Camp this year (grades 3-5), I have the task of keeping it simple. This age is not ready to move on to the deep things of Christianity; they still need the milk of the gospel.

Here are the daily themes for my week of camp, with the intention of keeping it simple enough that a third grader can grasp it, but also deep enough that they all know they need to believe in Jesus and live for him to be saved.

**Day 1: Deny Your Selfie and follow Jesus.** This will be the basic gospel message, tailored for elementary ages. Jesus loves them. He died for them. He also requires you to follow and love Him!

We will talk about sin, the effects of sin, how we all sin, and Jesus takes away our sin.

Day 2: Deny Your Selfie and forgive others. Don't we all have a tendency to hold on to grudges? We'll talk about having our feelings hurt and how we should be willing to forgive others anyway. Whatever your age is, we have to realize that OUR feelings aren't the most important thing in the world.

Day 3: Deny Your Selfie and serve (help) others. A lot of this week will focus on being like Jesus. Jesus forgave. Jesus served. Jesus said, "even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." Matthew 20:28 (ESV) We'll talk about how important it is that we don't think we deserve for someone else to serve us, but like Jesus, we are here to help others. We'll talk about some practical ways young people can serve.

Day 4: Deny Your Selfie and love others. Jesus definitely loved others. He is love. We will talk about loving people that maybe aren't so easy to love. We'll learn how to love those that might be alone or going through a hard time.

Simple. It's not about me. It's about God and other people. Love God, forgive, serve and love others. Even for those of us who have matured in the faith, it is good to revisit the basics and remember that we need to have the faith of a child.






