For it was there he learned 'the meaning of earthly existence lies, not as we have grown used to thinking, in prospering, but in the development of the soul.' I too can say, 'Bless you, prison' for it was there that I learned to see justice in the way that Amos and Micah and Jeremiah and Isaiah saw it."

Whoa! Thanking God for prison? Yes, if it refines us into the likeness of Christ, then yes, thank you even for prison. May God bless every one of you this Thanksgiving. While you are thanking God for all the things He has given us, thank Him for the things that we can't touch.

Thank Him for the things that shape our lives and mold us into the likeness of His wonderful Son. And thank Him most of all <u>for</u> His wonderful Son. Thank you God for Jesus.
