Why do we have to be restricted by seasons? I could go for a pumpkin pie for Easter dinner dessert. I don't mind eating watermelon in the winter or having a roasted turkey in the summer.

There are some things that occur at the right season. Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes, For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: (Eccl 3:1 ESV).

A time to be born, a time to die. A time for war or peace. To plant and harvest. A time to be silent and a time to speak. Etcetera.

There is one situation where we should never be silent. When someone needs to hear the gospel. We should always be ready to share the good news of Jesus Christ. Paul wrote: Preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching. (2 Timothy 4:2 ESV)

There was a time in the United States that it was 'in season' for preaching the gospel. There was a Great Awakening from the late 18th century until the mid-20th century. The Restoration Movement came into being during a particularly strong time in the early 1800s when it was very 'in season' to preach the word.

Today, however, our culture is trying to make Christianity as out of season as pumpkin pie at Easter. The world wants the church to accept, promote and celebrate ideals and morals that are outside of biblical teaching. Some churches, and some Christians, are following the world in an effort to be relevant or simply be accepted.


The Bible, however says we are to preach the word in season or out of season, i.e. when it is popular and when it is very unpopular. Not only preach, but when others get the word wrong, we reprove (correct). When someone misinterprets the word in order to promote one sin or another, we cannot let that slide. If they want to live in that sin, it is their choice, but they will not use God's word to justify it!

When they willfully sin and call good evil and evil good, we rebuke. We call abortion out for the evil it is. We speak out against redefining the world to allow for sexual deviancy.

When people struggle with doing what is right and standing against the onslaught of immorality, we encourage them to obey the word.

We do all this with grace and love. But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect. (1 Peter 3:15 ESV)

Remember, sharing the love and word of God never goes out of season!

Men's Breakfast: The men's breakfast will be Saturday, October 12th at 8:00 AM. Wayne Flack is cooking.


