Dec. 17<sup>th</sup>: As I was preparing for the Bible study I have at Valley Mental Health Center (VMHC) each Tuesday, I realized early that morning that the following Tuesday would be Christmas Eve.

I began to wonder, should I go ahead and have the study on Christmas Eve, or use that day to finish up on some church prep for Christmas Eve church service and also get ready for company we were having at home?

There are about four or five people that regularly attend the study. It wouldn't disappoint that many people if I didn't have it, and got some personal things done instead. Yet I also know those few folks that do attend might be VERY disappointed because they don't get out very much at all, and may not get visitors over the holiday.

I needed to have this figured out before I went on the 17<sup>th</sup> so I could let them know the plan for 24<sup>th</sup>. I messaged Gina to get her thoughts, but before she had a chance to answer, I felt the Lord telling me I ought to go ahead and have it. Gina confirmed that when she replied, "It's only an hour, our kids won't be here until later and we can just tell the rest of the family not to arrive until after lunch."

So I told the folks at VMHC that I would be there next week on Christmas Eve. We would sing a bunch of Christmas Carols and I would give them a short Christmas Eve devotion.

Dec. 24<sup>th</sup>: I showed up at the regular time in the morning. A couple of people who were usually at study weren't there because they were out with family. However, there were two people who joined us that had never been in the study before!

We sang six or seven songs, and a young man (late 20s to early 30s) who had never been with us before joined our study part way through the singing.

He stayed as I gave a shortened version of the message I would give at our candlelight service. We closed with three more songs, prayed, and finished our time.

This very polite young man asked if he could have some of my time before I left. He wanted to ask me a question about a passage in Ecclesiastes that had been bothering him. I explained the context of the book and how the passage fit in. It was neat to see the light in his eyes as he understood. He thanked me, we shook hands as I wished him a merry Christmas.

As we were speaking, one of the regular attendees quietly waited and listened to our conversation. After the young man left, the regular informed me that the young man I was speaking with was Muslim.

This young Muslim man sat through and sang carols praising the Savior's birth. He listened intently to a devotion that explained Jesus was born to die on the cross for our sins and is our Lord and Savior – very God in the flesh. He has been reading a Bible and asked a Christian pastor to explain a passage to him. What a blessing!!

God blessed me so much in that experience because I listened and obeyed.

It didn't fatten my bank account. It didn't make our church larger. Yet I was blessed on this Christmas Eve because I got to tell about the birth of Jesus to someone who doesn't even believe he is the son of God. And I didn't even know a Muslim was there until it was all over.

How might I have changed my attitude toward him or the presentation of the Christmas account had I known a Muslim was in the study? I truly felt like God orchestrated the entire event.

I don't know if this young man will come to another study. I don't know if he will ever become a Christian. I do know he has heard the gospel and I know how I can pray for him.

I didn't share this to tell folks how awesomely close to God I am! (That's sarcasm there!) I mess up a lot more than I'd like to admit. I realize there are a lot more areas I need to do a better job of listening to the Lord.

I just want to share this to encourage everyone to listen to the Holy Spirit in your life. Get into the word. Spend time in prayer. You never know how God will use you if you will simply listen and obey.

I don't want anyone to miss out on what God wants to do in <u>your</u> life and the blessings that come with obedience!

Here's to listening and obeying in 2020!
